STARTING THE YEAR STRONG WITH THE COMMANDER'S CHALLENGE!

As laid out in the 2026-27 Membership Program, we will continue issuing quarterly challenges to our Posts and rewarding those who lead their divisions in recruiting as well as Life Member upgrades. Every quarter (July 1-September 30), we will award points to the Posts as follows:

- Recruit a new annual Member into the Post: 1 point
- An annual or lapsed Member converts to life: 5 points
- Recruit a new Life Member into the Post: 10 points

At the end of the quarter, the Post that leads their membership division in points will receive a special award designated by the Commander-in-Chief. All Posts who meet these quarterly challenges will also be featured on a video display at the National Convention to recognize their achievements.

MEMBERSHIP GOALS

As is set out in the 2026-27 National Membership Program, we are aiming for membership growth as well as a minimum of 80% retention of our annual members. Focusing our efforts on growth through recruiting and stability via retention will be essential in our efforts to increase our membership strength. CONVENTION REGISTRATION

Section 222 of the Manual of Procedure states each Post will pay, in advance, a National Convention registration fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25) which shall entitle the Post to a packet of convention information and materials and one identified registered delegate for the VFW National Convention. Each additional delegate attending the National Convention will pay a ten dollar (\$10) delegate fee provided the Post has paid the mandated \$25 advance registration fee. All advance registrations should be mailed to the VFW National Headquarters, 406 W. 34th Street, Kansas City, MO 64111. **ATTN:** Convention Registration, Quartermasters are strongly encouraged to register delegates utilizing the on-line membership system (OMS).

All-American Eligibility

The **2025-26 Program Year** closed **June 30, 2026**. The **2026-27 Program Year** opens **July 1, 2026**. To qualify for **All-American**, a **minimum donation of \$125** must be donated to **VMS** by **June 30, 2027**. VMS donations will only be handled through the Dashboard. All Posts must click on the **"VMS Donation"** tab on the **Dashboard** to donate. **DO NOT CLICK THE LINK IN RED THAT SAYS "DONATE"**. Do not send checks to the National Headquarters. If a Post does not use a credit card, the Post will send their donation to their Department HQs, and the Department HQs will submit the donation for their Post. Credit will automatically update on the Dashboard the following day. Overseas Departments will donate to the other programs through the link also in lieu of participation. This will automatically update the following day.

When you make your **\$125.00** or more donation, all that needs to be entered into the box is **125** or more. The **\$** and **.00** are **not required** in the donation amount box.

DISPLAYING MILITARY SERVICE SYMBOLS. Military service flags, insignias, etc. should be displayed in the following order (left to right as you face the flags): Army, Marine Corps, Navy, Air Force, Space Force, and then Coast Guard. VFW 24th ANNUAL NATIONAL CONVENTION SILENT AUCTION INFORMATION. It is time again to check out the variety of great items that are donated by our VFW Departments. Silent Auction forms have been emailed to each Department. You will be able to view and bid on these items as they are received. The bidding begins at 8:00 a.m., Saturday, July 25, and goes on until Monday, July 27, at 3 p.m. when the bidding ends. Winners may pay for their items after 3:00 p.m., Monday at a specific register at the VFW Store until 4:00 p.m.

ATTENTION WINNING BIDDERS: All payments for winning bids will need to be paid by credit card. All major credit cards will be accepted including Apple Pay, Google Pay, and Cash App. For those winners unavailable Monday, may pay on Tuesday, July 28, beginning at 8:00 a.m., until NOON (12:00 p.m.), when the exhibit hall closes. Items not paid and picked up after this time will be returned to VFW National Headquarters and dispersed from there. Winning bidders are contacted for a shipping address, and shipping costs will be applied to their bid. If we are unable to contact that person, the item will be offered to the next highest bidder.

OUTSTANDING NATIONAL COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD. Each year on July 1, the National Programs office will determine the top community service Posts in each conference, based on their community service reporting and total impact, from July 1 to June 30 of the previous year. Your total impact of community service is figured by the money spent to host and organize the community service event, plus total hours all volunteers participated, plus the mileage for all volunteers (Dollars Donated + Hours + Mileage = Total Impact).

These four Posts will be awarded the Award for Community Service and will be invited to attend the VFW National Convention. The Post Commander (or designated representative) and a guest will receive round-trip airfare, hotel accommodations for five nights, and a \$599 stipend to receive the award at the VFW National Convention.

NATIONAL COMMUNITY SERVICE POST OF THE YEAR. Each Department will have an NCSP winner based on total impact also. National will select based on end of year reports on July 1.

Winners will also be published in the Convention program booklet and receive a street sign identifying this national award for the Post to put up in their community.

IT'S SCHOLARSHIP TIME! It is the perfect time to contact schools, youth groups, parent organizations and others with information about Voice of Democracy® and Patriot's Pen. Schools are making curriculum decisions now and parents are thinking about scholarships.

NEW VOICE OF DEMOCRACY AND PATRIOT'S PEN THEMES. The 2026–27 themes have been chosen by Senior Vice Commander-in-Chief Cory Geisler. The Voice of Democracy and Patriot's Pen theme will be **“What a Veteran Taught Me About America”**

NEW VOICE OF DEMOCRACY AND PATRIOT'S PEN ENTRY FORMS. The new 2026-27 Voice of Democracy and Patriots Pen entry forms are now available on the VFW website.

PATRIOT DAY, SEPTEMBER 11. Per Presidential Proclamation, September 11, is designated as “Patriot Day.” The President requests the flag of the United States to be flown at half-staff (sunrise to sunset) and a moment of silence observed in honor of the individuals who lost their lives on that day due to terrorist attacks on the United States. NATIONAL POW/MIA RECOGNITION DAY, SEPT. 20. Posts should conduct an appropriate ceremony. Information on conducting a ceremony can be found in the current VFW Manual of Procedure. For POW/MIA merchandise, click <https://www.vfwstore.org/category/memorial/pow-mia>.

“UPDATED” POW/MIA FLAG — OFFICIAL DISPLAY DAYS. Under previous Public Law 105-85 (Nov. 16, 1997), it indicated there were only six days that federal agencies, military installations and U.S. post offices were required to display the POW/MIA flag. Now under new law, Public Law 116-67 (Nov. 7, 2019), it is required that the POW/MIA flag, on certain federal properties, be flown on all days on which the flag of the United States is displayed. To purchase a POW/MIA flag, go to vfwstore.org/products/GP237.

NATIONAL COMMUNITY SERVICE VOLUNTEER RECOGNITION PROGRAM.

IRS AND VFW AWARD MONIES. The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) requires that any recipient that receives more than a \$599 award should receive a Form 1099 identifying the proceeds as taxable. This will include the VFW programs Patriot's Pen and Smart/Maher VFW National Citizenship Education Teacher Award.

"Buddy"® Poppy

NATIONAL "BUDDY"® POPPY DISPLAY CONTEST. Buddy Poppy Display contest entry forms have been sent to VFW Departments for dissemination with a copy of the rules for entry. A VFW Department officer must sign off on the form and submit it to VFW National Programs office by 1 July 2026. The time frame for registering and setting up the Department winning Buddy Poppy displays for the national judging at convention will be the same as usual. Department winning entries may be set up beginning at 8:00 a.m., Saturday, July 25, until noon, Monday, July 27, 2026. Winning displays will be identified with the appropriate ribbons on Tuesday morning, and announced later, on the convention floor. **Displays must be removed prior to 11:30 a.m. on Tuesday.** Any displays left after this time will be removed for disposal by convention center personnel during the disassembly of the exhibit hall.

"BUDDY"® POPPY CAMPAIGN. Although we emphasize Buddy Poppies on Veterans Day and Memorial Day, it is important to realize that the distribution of Buddy Poppies should be a year-round exercise. Each time a Post participates in an activity where the public will be present, Buddy Poppies should be present as a fundraising tool and simply to recognize our fallen comrades. Where the VFW appears, Buddy Poppies should be a constant reminder that we will never forget those who have perished in the name of liberty. Just as "They Gave, Will You?" is a year-round thing, so should the distribution of VFW Buddy Poppies.

Remember that your poppies should be ordered a minimum of three (3) weeks in advance of your distribution date.

BUDDY POPPY POLICY AND PROCEDURES:

- 1) Departments must order poppies through OMS.
- 2) All claims of non-receipt of a Buddy Poppy order must be made within 60 days of the date of the order or will NOT be replaced free of charge.
- 3) All orders for the traditional Buddy Poppy, Anniversary Poppies or tin tab poppies must be placed through your Department Headquarters. Auxiliaries must go through their Post to order all poppies.
- 4) The tin tabs do count towards the Buddy Poppy requirement for the All-American program.
- 5) If you do not receive your order within four weeks of placing it with your Department, please contact your Department Headquarters to report you have not received your order.

6) All poppies are shipped within 10 days of ordering except orders placed in June and July, due to preparation for National Convention, please allow an additional five business days.

Miscellaneous items (coin cans, buttons, posters, etc.) should be ordered directly from the VFW Store at vfwstore.org/category/programs/buddypoppy or by calling Member Service Center at 1.833.839.8387.

The Manual of Procedure provides that Post relief funds may be used for programs such as Voice of Democracy, Patriot's Pen, Citizenship Education, and Community Service as long as suggestions in the chairperson's guidebooks are used as an example of promoting these programs.

Posts are further reminded that Section 711 of the Manual of Procedure provides that other non-profit organizations, exempt from taxes under Section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code, may assist with the distribution of Buddy Poppies, provided there shall be no division of proceeds. A donation to these groups may be made from the Post general fund.

VFW ANNIVERSARY POPPIES. The silver, gold and diamond anniversary Buddy Poppies are for Posts that are currently in their 25th, 50th or 75th anniversary years. For Posts currently in their 100th year anniversary, they can order any color and as many as they need.

Please limit your order of anniversary poppies to 1,000 to ensure stock does not run out unless you are currently in your 100th year. These are ordered through the Department in OMS and processed the same as the traditional & tin tab poppies. Currently we have no plans to replenish inventory of Anniversary poppies due to increased cost and the small quantities we sell of Anniversary Poppies.

National Veterans Service

NVS Events at National Convention

National Veterans Service would like to invite all delegates and attendees of the upcoming VFW 127th National Convention in Reno, Nevada, to participate in the following events. Please check the convention schedule or download the convention app for the most current locations.

At 1:00 p.m. on Friday, July 24, the **National Veterans Service Advisory Committee** will meet in Room A7-9 to discuss matters of importance to the VFW national service program. Please check the convention schedule or the convention app to verify the time and location.

Saturday, July 25 through Monday, July 27 from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. and Tuesday, July 28, from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon, in Hall 2-3 (dates & times subject to change but can be verified in the convention app), there will be a **Veterans Walk-in Claims Clinic** at which veterans and dependents will be assisted by a combined team of VFW Service Officers and VA benefits and health care representatives to facilitate and expedite new and existing claims, appeals and health care issues.

Beginning on Saturday, July 25, in Hall 2-3, there will be a **Health Fair**. This will include health screenings including blood pressure checks and glucose checks. VA representatives will be on hand to discuss VA health care enrollment, community care, caregiver support, mental health, women's health care and other programs.

On Sunday, July 26 from 11:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon, NVS will be holding **Providing Local Benefits Assistance** training during which NVS staff will discuss the role of the Post Benefits Advisor, when to refer veterans to an accredited representative, and ways that anyone can help veterans and their families.

On Sunday, July 26, at 1:00 p.m., the **Committee on Veterans Service Resolutions** will be meeting to deliberate proposed resolutions addressing veterans' health care, benefits, economic opportunity, employment, and other benefit-associated resolutions. If you don't have an assigned committee meeting or workshop to attend at that time, we encourage you to sit in and listen to what they have to say.

BEWARE of Fraudulent Text Messages Claiming to be from VA!

Many veterans have been receiving text messages that appear to have come from the VA. An example of one of these texts is below:

"VA Benefits & Services: Your VA profile is missing your home address, mailing address, or both. Update it now so you don't miss important benefits information: va.gov/profile"

After doing some research we have learned that this is a phishing scam and that scammers are spoofing the Department of Veterans Affairs, preying on veterans by sending alarming texts that compel them to click a link and "update" sensitive personal information on a fake but legitimate-looking website. We have notified the VA of this scam, and it has been forwarded to the VA Fraud Prevention team.

If you or someone you know receives one of these texts:

- **Never** click links in unexpected text messages claiming to be from the VA.
- **Verify directly:** If you suspect your profile may actually need an update, navigate to VA.gov directly or contact VA at 1.800.827.1000 – do not use the link in the text!
- **Contact VA:** If you have been the target of a scam or suspect fraudulent activity, contact VA immediately at 1.800.827.1000.
- **Report:** Veterans who suspect they have experienced fraud can find out more at VSAFE.gov or by calling (833) 38V-SAFE. (833.388.7233) Reports of fraud can also be submitted to the Federal Trade Commission online at <https://reportfraud.ftc.gov/>.

While the VA does occasionally send text messages for appointment reminders or claim updates, they will never demand that a veteran click a link in a text to supply personal or address information.

Delivering Our Priorities to Congress

During the first six months of this year, the National Legislative Service has provided testimony 10 times to the 119th Congress on behalf of our organization.
