## Memorial Day 2019

**WHEREAS**, throughout America's history, brave men and women have defended freedom and preserved liberty at home and abroad; and

**WHEREAS**, in 1971, the United States Congress established a national day of observance – Memorial Day – to recognize and remember men and women who fought and died in America's wars; and

**WHEREAS**, on Memorial Day 2019, we pause in honor of those brave men and women who served their country with dignity and honor; and

**WHEREAS**, since 2001, among Americans who have died in service are more than 70 patriots with Wyoming ties; and

**WHEREAS**, Wyoming citizens continue to give faithful service to Wyoming and the nation and all of us continue to be indebted to those who have served and those serving now. We honor these brave men and women on duty here and abroad – and we give thanks for those who have returned home safely; and

**WHEREAS**, Memorial Day is a time to honor those who have given their lives for the liberties we enjoy and those who have served and those who currently serve – protecting our freedom worldwide.

**NOW THEREFORE, I, MARK GORDON**, Governor of the State of Wyoming, do hereby proclaim May 27, 2019 as

in Wyoming and encourage the observation of The National Moment of Remembrance at 3 p.m. on Memorial Day, Monday, May 27.
